#### **Opportunity Class Applications**

Last week, all Year 4 students were given an expression of interest to apply for an Opportunity Class placement. Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and high potential students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6. Applications are made online at <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/publicschools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-</u>

<u>classes/year-5</u> and can be made up until Friday May 7. Applicants will be required to sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Wednesday 21 July 2021. If your child misplaced their note and you are interested in applying, please contact the front office to get another note.

#### NAPLAN

In Week 4, students in Years 3 and 5 will sit NAPLAN. On Tuesday, students will sit the Language Conventions and Writing assessments, on Wednesday the Reading on Thursday the Numeracy assessment and assessment. Friday will be used as a catch up day for any students who missed assessments throughout the week. Please ensure your child is at school on time on the days of these assessments, as students arriving late cannot join the assessment once it has started. We ask that you do not put any undue pressure on students in the lead up to NAPLAN. While they are a formnalised assessment, they are just one of very many assessments that teachers use to monitor and evaluate student progress. A students' level of skill, knowledge, achievement or potential is not defined by a NAPLAN score.

## FROM THE INSTRUCTIONAL LEADER

What a great start to Term 2!

Our teachers have been working very hard to use evidence and data to reflect on the needs of their students and make conscious decisions about how they can best support their class at every level. Our Staff Development Day involved us looking at key pieces of evidence to inform our practices in reading. These evidence and data sources included:

• NAPLAN - historical data of our results across Years 3 to 5 and student growth between these year levels.

• Student Interviews - Videos of students from Kindergarten to Year 6 being interviewed around what they like and don't like about reading and how their teacher provides feedback to them.

• Professional Judgements - Reflections on our reading programs at a Stage level.

• PAT Reading Data - External assessment data that our students are involved in from Years 1 - 6.

- PROBE2 Individual comprehension assessments of students from Years 2 6.
- PM Benchmark levels Reading levels across Stage 1.
- Lexile levels From Years 3 6.

• Literacy Progressions – an online DoE assessment platform where students work along a progression of knowledge and skills in reading.

• Teacher surveys.

We broke into groups and were able to engage in reflective conversations and reach whole-school priorities based on what the data and evidence was telling us.



From here, we are going to be professionally developing our knowledge of how to explicitly teach reading based on current evidence-based research.

I look forward to sharing with you what we discover as we embark on this journey!

# **Check-in Assessment for Years 4 and 6**

Dear parents and carers,

Year 4 and 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment.

The check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor Year\* student learning following the period of learning from home.

The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

• The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 4 and 6 students during Term 2 Week 4.

Students with disability may receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.

Advice on headphones:

Students will be using our school set of headphones that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment. You are more than welcome to provide your own child's headphones or earbuds for the assessment provided they have a computer connection of a jack or a USB.



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## **STALL**
